**$\frac{7}{8}$  METER** The eighth note must remain equal in time value whether it is in a group of two (  $\overline{\overline{J}}\overline{J}$  ) or three (  $\overline{J}\overline{\overline{J}}\overline{J}$  ). The resulting irregular accents create a fascinating rhythm. It is suggested that the music be learned with a metronome set at about 152 for an eighth note, gradually increasing the tempo until the singers begin to feel the lilt. The tempo change indicated for the third stanza may be disregarded, for if the music should begin a little too fast and/or the tempo gradually increase, a still faster tempo here would destroy the delightful quality of the  $\frac{7}{8}$  meter.
